## SC rejects pleas on 100 % VVPAT counting, paper ballot

■ Modi claims that INDIA bloc "committed the sin of creating distrust against EVMs"; Law Minister says Opposition took every opportunity to "defame" ECI by questioning EVM credibility

The Supreme Court
on Friday rejected
paper ballots and also
100 per cent cross-verification of votes cast on
EVMs with a Voter Verfinable Paper Audit Trail
(VVPAT), holding that
suspicions regarding
tampering of the voting machines were "unfounded".

As the country voted in round two of the
seven-phase 2024 Lok
Sabha elections, the top
court said the Electronic
Voting Machines(EVM)
were "secure" and eliminates booth capturing
and bogus voting.
Weighing in on the in-

Weighing in on the in-tensely debated EVM is-sue that has long divided sue that has long divided political parties, a bench of Justiees Sanjiv khanna and Dipankar Datta said the plea for return to the ballot paper system was "foible and unsound", noting that the weakness of this system was well known and doc-



umented. The two judges gave two separate but concurring verdicts. "While maintaining a

balanced perspective is crucial in evaluating systems or institutions, blindly distrusting any aspect of the system can breed unwarranted scepticism, the court said, adding that democ-racy is all about striving racy is all about striving to build harmony and trust between all institations.

The top court's long anticipated verdiet quickly found echo in the pollscape with Prime Minister Narendra Modi

Minister Narendra Modi saying at a rally in Ara-ria in Bihar that it was a "tight slap" on the Congress-led opposi-tion which now must "apologise" for commit-ting the "sin of creating distrust" against EVMs. Hailing the verdict, he

The ministry of education has asked the Central Board of Secondary Education to work out logistics for conducting board exams twice a year from the 2025-25 academic session, according to sources.

The plan for introducing a semester system has

The plan for introduc-ing a semester system has been ruled out, they said.

The ministry and the Central Board of Sec-ondary Education will hold consultations with hold consultations with school principals next month for conducting board exams twice a year, the sources said.

The CRSE is currently in the process of work-ing out the modalities of how will the academic calendar be structured to accummodate anoth-er set of board exams without impacting the without impacting the undergraduate admis sion schedule, they said.

"The ministry has asked the CBSE to work on the logistics of how will board exams be con-ducted twice a year. The board is working out the modalities and a consul-tation will be organised next month with school principals," a source said. शिक्षा सहन अक्षाक्षा करवाहा

The idea being explored is to conduct two editions of the board exams at the end of the year from the 2025-26 academic session but the modalities still need to be worked out. However, there is no plan to implement the semester system, the source added. The ministry's initial plan was to introduce bianual board exams from the 2024-25 academic session, however, it has been pushed back by a year.

### Arms, ammunition found in CBI raid in Sandeshkhali



New Delhi/Kolkata

The CBI on Friday seized arms and ammunition, including a police service revolver and foreign-made firearms, during searches at two premises of an associate of new-suspended TMC leader Shajaham Sheikh in West Bengal's Sandeshkhali, officials said.

The searches were conducted in connection with the January attack on an Enforcement Directorate (ED) team by a mob that was allegedly instigated by Sheikh,

who was arrested by the West Bengal Police on February 29 in the case. Teams of the Central Bureau Investigation (CBI), the bomb detection squad, the National Security Guard (NSG), the central paramilitary forces and the West Bengal Police were part of the searches at the village — a riverine delta—on the fringes of the Sunderbans in North 24 Parganas district.

EC books Tejasvi Surya for seeking votes on religion

"Case is booked against Tejasvi Surya MP and Candidate of Bengaluru South PC on 25-04-24 at Jayanagar PS u/s 123(3) for posting a video in X handle and soliciting votes on the ground of religion," Chief Electoral Officer, Karnataka post-



ed on X.

The case has been filed with Jayanagar police station in Bengaluru.
On Thursday, the BJP MP shared a video

on X, showcasing the 'Surya Tilak' ceremony of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya, accompanied by the statement: 'Our generation was blessed

to witness the majestic Surya Tilak on Bhagwan Shri Ram at Ayodhya on Ram Navami. A wait of almost 500 years & a wish of crores of Bharatiyas was fulfilled by PM Shri @narendramodi Ji. For Bharatiyata to survive, vote for BJP!"

It is to be noted that the EC's Model Code of Conduct (MCC) clearly states: "No party or cannotidate shall include in any activity which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hattred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic."

WhatsApp on Thursday submitted before the Delhi High Court that if it is made or compelled to break encryption of messages, then the platform will stop functioning. The submissions came while the division bench led by the Acting Chief Justice was hearing the petitions moved by WhatsApp and Facebook challenging newly amended IT Rules.

"As a platform, we are saying, if we are told to break encryption, then WhatsApp goes," the lawyer who appeared for



WhatsApp submitted.

The requirement was against the privacy of users and the rule was introduced without any consultation, said WhatsApp while opposing the amendment in IT Rules.

Earlier, the Centre had told the Delhi High Court that WhatsApp and Facebook which monetizes users' infor-

mation for business or commercial purposes are not legally entitled to claim that it protects

to claim that it protects privacy.

In fact, the regulators of various countries clearly hold that Face-book should be fixed with accountability for its services and data management practices.

During the searches, the CBI seized three foreign-made revolvers and one foreign-made remains and one foreign-made.

and one foreign-made pistol, one Indian re-volver, one Colt official voiver, one Coft official issue police revolver, one country-made pistol, 120 nine min bullets, 50 cartridges of .45 calibre, 120 nine min cartridges, 50 cartridges of .380 and eight cartridges of .32, the spokesperson said.

"Besides, many incriminating documents related to Shajahan have also been recovered. Some items suspected to be country-made bombs have also been recovered, which are being handlled and disposed of by the teams of the NSG," the spokesperson said in a statement.

As officials spread across Sandeshkhali to search targetted locations, NSG units had the responsibility for detecting and handling explosives found during the operation, the officials said.

The party's reaction came after Nadda alleged that the Congress intends to snatch the rights of Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs) and Other Backward Classes (OBCs) to benefit Muslims.

The BJP chief also cited then-prime min-ister Manmohan Singh's 2006 statement in which he had reported-ly said that minorities. especially Muslims, nave the first right on

the country's resources.
"J P Nadda's allegations are based on lies. It seems that Nadda is following Prime Minis-ter Modi and has turned to 'falsehood'," Ramesh

to 'falsehood'," Ramesh said.

"The real thing is that the BJP is in panic. The prime minister and the BJP president know that their party is wiped out in the South and is halved in the North. They fear that they are losing this election and scared of it, their only strategy is polarisation, polarisation," he said in a statement posted on 'X'. Vijayapura/Ballari: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday took potshots at Prime Minis-ter Narendra Modi over his attack on the grand old party, saying he is scared and may even shed

old party, saying he is scared and may even shed tears on the stage. He called the BJP Bharatiya Chombu Party'. Chombu in Kantanda means round water pot, which is sometimes used to convey emptiness and deception.

"You have heard the prime minister's speeches. He is scared. It's possible that he may shed tears on stage," Gandhi said, addressing public meetings in the district headquarters towns of Vijayapura and Ballari in the party-governed state.

Modi has targeted the Congress on a variety of issues in recent campaign rallies, including "mangalsutra", "rediscribution of wealth" and "inheritance tax" charges.

The former Congress chief accused Modi of 'diverting public atten-tion' through various means. "Sometimes he talks about China and Pakietra, and come-Pakistan, and some-times he will make you beat plates and ask you to switch on the torch light of your mobile

to switch on the torch light of your mobile phones."

He pointed out that there are three to four core issues in India including poverty, unemployment and price rise, and claimed that only Congress can eradicate unemployment, contain price rise and give people their due share.

"Modi has only snatched money from poor people, He has made some billionaires. There are 22 people who have wealth equivalent to the 70 crore people of the country. Just one per cent people are controlling 40 per cent of the wealth of the nation," Gandhi alleged.

## NSC- A necessity for survival of sports federations & associations



Numerous irregular-ities and aberrations were observed by the Ministry of Youth Af-fairs and Sports, in the management and gove-ernance of the sports bodies and Federations within our country, at the National level.

MJ (Retd.) Nazmi Waziri rightly
observed that National Sponts Code "is the
adoption of 'good governance' practises by the
NSFs and the IO.
It all started in 2005,
when the Supreme Court
of India in the matter of
Zee Telefilms versus Union of Indiaz held that
sports bodies in India
do not fall within the
definition of 'State'. This
decision led to a chaotic
situation where sports
associations within India started operating
without any constraint
or control or rules. The
National Sports Bodies
became personal clubs
of the rich and famous
and the government was
helploses in controlling and the government was helpless in controlling the situation. The man-ner in which various sports were being ad-ministered and regulat-ed in India became an embarrassment for the Central Government at Central Government at an international level, which was reflected by mediocre performance of Indian sportspersons at International events.

Numerous irregular-ities and aberrations were observed by the Ministry of Youth Af-fairs and Sports, in the management and gov-ernance of the sports bodies and Federations within our country, at within our country, at the National level.

Initially, a committee chaired by Justice Mukul Mudgal (Retired) was appointed for drafting of National Sports Development Bill, 2013. The committee sought views from Stakeholders in sports from throughout India including journalists, writers, athletes and activists. The Olympic charter was heavily relied upon by the committee to assign responsibility to the national Olympic committee, to bid for international sports events and to conduct and development of sports within India, in consonance with international standards of conducting sports. However, this bill faced severe criticism from all the parties and even from the government and was not supported by the government, resulting in its imminent failure.

failure.

In these circumstances, in order to ensure a unified improvement of the level of Sports administration in a vast country like India, the Ministry of Youth Afairs and Sports, started issuing various circulars, notifications, orders, etc. laying down different conditions to provide recognition and financial assistance to the Indian Olympic Association (hereinafter referred to as "IOA") and National Sports Federations (hereinafter referred to as "NSFs") operating at the National level in the country.

All such circulars

All such circulars, notifications, orders, instructions, amalgamated with necessary modifications, providing a framework for the effective governance of the IOA and NSFs were

into a compendium and comprehensive-ity termed as "National Sports Development Code of India, 2011" (hereinafter referred to as "NSC") in terms of the recommendation of the sub-committee conub-committee stituted by department related Parliamentary Standing Committee on

Human Resource Development. This NSC was notified in supersession of all earlier instructions on the subject matter. It was noted in the NSC that at the national level sports is considered at par with public education and public education and public health and that the development of sports was a public function. Internationally laws and guidelines have been enacted for regulation of sports in national and public interest. Issues of Doping, age related fraud, child abuse, sexualharassment, gambling, gender inequality, professional management, financial accountability, competition and/or raccism in the field of sports have been attempted to be regulated under this code. NSC promotes good governance practices in the management and administration of sports at all levels to bring the practices of all entities involved in the governance of any sport in consonance with in-ternational standards in consonance with in-ternational standards, especially in accord-ance with principles enshrined in the Inter-national Olympic Com-mittee charter.

mittee charter.

The NSC took note of an order dated 2 May 2010 passed by High Court of Delhi in Civil Writ Petition no. 7868 of 2005 in the matter of Indian Hockey Federation whereby it was observed that the government guidelines government by the NSFs were valid and binding and enforceable and that the tenure clause was not in violation of the Olympic charter.

charter.

The Court in its order also observed that the Government of India is fully competent to make regulations on the NSF and the IOA in view of entry to and 13 in List 1, (Union list). The order also observed that the NSFs, though having autonomy, needed government recognition to represent the country. It was also observed that international sporting events were essentially part of diplomatic relations of the nations and multiple considerations like security, concerns of players, apartheid, perceived, human, right violations et cetera were to be taken care of by the central Government. perceived, human, right violations et cetera were to be taken care of by the central Government. Orders passed in another public interest litigation number 195 of 2010 in the matter of Rahul Mehra versus union of India were also considered while formulating the NSC, where the High Court took serious view on the mismanagement of the sports sector in the country and expressed concern at the action on the part of the government in implementing and enforcing its own guidelines, particularly those relating to age and tenure. The NSC also clarifies that the annual recognition, along with grants, facilities and concessions, granted by the government of India to NSFs.

From time to time,

From time to time, the government issues updated guidelines in the form of subsequent circulars, notifications, orders, etc. which also amalgamate into the National Sports Code (NSC) and become binding upon the IOA and NSFs in order to ensure more transparency in the decision-making process by the IOA and NSFs. Through its provisions, the NSC has played a crucial role in shaping the administra-

tion and regulation of IOA and NSFs, ensur-ing proper management, fostering athlete welfare, tostering athlete welfare, and encouraging the spirit of inclusivity and meritocracy within the Indian Sporting Ecosystem. With its emphasis on creating a robust framework for sports administration, the code has been instrumental in revolutionizing the

Indian sports land-scape and paying the way for the nation's ath-letes to strive for excel-lence on both national and international stages.

Despite the issuance of strict guidelines in the form of NSC, various complaints were being received against the irregularities in the management of various NSFs which were managing its affairs in blatant violation of NSC. Accordingly, the Courts of our country stepped up in to ensure strict adherence of NSC by all the NSFs and their constituent members. Despite the issuance stituent members.

One such batch of is-One such batch of its sues was comprehen-sively dealt by the Di-vision Bench of High Court of Delhi in the matter titled as "Rahul Mehra Vs Union Of In-dia" 4- The said Pettition dia "4. The said Petition was preferred in public interest, by Rahul Mehra, an advocate and a sports enthusiast, be-seeching the Court to; a) direct all NSFs and Indian Olympic Association (hereinafter referred to as '10A') to strictly comply with NSC; b) identify and thereafter suspend the faulting NSF and direct the Government not to extend financial assistance, tax concessions and other perks to such NSF; and c) direct the Government not to reinstate any perks to defaulting NSF until the management of the said identified NSF/OA is not brought into conformity with NSC. brought into co

The Division Bench of Delhi High Court, vide its order dated 16 August 2022, while adjudicat-ing the aforementioned Petition, observed that several portions of con-stitution of IOA were in contravention to NSC which require rectifi-cation and accordingly held:

a) there can no posi-tion as "Life President" or any such permanent post for an individual in IOA;

b) voting and election results only in terms of the Sports Code will be recognized and differen-tial voting rights can be permitted;

c) Model Election guidelines provided un-der NSC must be strictly adhered to;

d) Only NSFs for Olympic disciplines should be member of IOA with voting rights;

e) age and tenure limit should be applicable to all members of the Executive Committee (hereinafter referred to as "EC") of IOA as well as to all the members of General Assembly;

f) there cannot be any restrictive, undemocrat-ic clause, including as to who can contest for any position.

g) IOA must have In-dependent Ethics, Ath-letes, Election and Ar-bitration Commissions, and Ombudsman, deand Ombudsman, de-void of any control, di-rect or indirect, by the IOA or NSF. These com-missions must be funded by the Government from the budgetary allocation for NSFs including IOA;

h) 25% prominent sportspersons of out-standing merit with voting rights in Gen-eral Assembly and EC is mandatory in terms of clause 3.20 of 2001 Guidelines and para 9.3 (xii) of the Sports Code.

i) a person against whom criminal charg-es have been framed should not be permitted to be a member either of the EC or the General Assembly;

j) EC size should be reasonable and not un-wieldy; and

k) Persons seeking re-election for the same post must secure two-thirds majority.

While holding the above, the Court ac-cordingly, struck down various provisions of the Constitution of IOA to Constitution of IOA to bring the same in con-formity with the NSC. It was also held by the High Court that the Sports Code must be made ap-plicable to the IOA and policable to the IOA and to every constituent NSFs and to every State and District Level Association. The Delhi High Court observed that the NSFs must comply with each mandatory aspect of Sports Code, which can neither be diluted nor whittled-down. The Court observed that despite repeated opportunities and warnings to IOA to amend its constitution in terms of NSC, the IOA had failed to amend its constitution.

amend its constitution.

Accordingly, the Court held that the compliance of Sports Code is non-negotiable. If an NSF does not comply with the law of the land, it will receive no recognition from the Government. All benefits and facilities to it will stop promptly. The Court further observed that the Governmental monitoring of compliance is essential to ensure strict adherence of NSC by IOA, which is expected to be prompt, robust and meticulous at all times. Accordingly, the court appointed a six at nii times. Accordingly, the court appointed a six member Committee of Administrators and the affairs of the IOA were put in the bands of the said Committee in order to: a) assist in preparation and adoption of amended constitution of IOA in conformity with NSC and court rulings; b) prepare electoral college to conduct election of EC of IOA; c) carry out day to day governance of IOA; c) carry out day to day governance of IOA; and d) facilitate holding of elections and to finally hand over the affairs to a democratically elected body in berms of its constitution which will be adopted, preferably within a period of 16 weeks from the date the COA members give their assent. Similar directions were also passed by the Supreme Court vide order dated 18 May 2022 passed in the matter of "All India Football Federation vs. Rahul Mehra & Ors" (SI.P. (Civil) Nos. 30748-30749/2017) involving affairs of another NSE.

The issue qua non-adherence to the NSC/ National Sports Code once again came up for adjudication by the High Court of Delhi, in the matter titled as "K.P. Rao vs Union of India & Ors", The issues raised in the said petition and other batch petitions

The Court, while re-

The Court, while re-lying on the judgment passed in the matter of Rahul Mehra (supra) Rahul Mehra (supra) and judgment passed in "Mahipal Singh vs. Un-ion of India & Ors"; W.P. (C) No. 4601/2013, held that the age and tenure restriction upon the restriction upon the members of the Governing Body, as provided by NSC, is applicable not only to NSFs but also upon all their constituents i.e., state and dis tricl associations. The Court further observed that the members/representatives of State and District Associations must always be in compliance with the restrictions imposed by NSC and if they fail or refuse to comply with the same, they would be liable for action which may entail de-affiliation and/ or removal from being a recognized district and state constituent of the concerned NSF. It was further held that if the representatives of the State associations to the NSF and the representatives of the State Association are not compliant of the age and tenure restriction imposed by the Sports Code, then they shall not constitute the electoral college and shall be disqualified from contesting for any post of the executive committee and also from easting their vote for such an elections. It was further directed that all the state associations and district associations must hold fresh elections strictly in accordance to age and tenure restriction im-posed by NSC.

In view of the above discussion, it is apparent that it is no more res integra that all the NSFs and their constituents are strictly bound by the NSC and their constituents are strictly bound by the NSC and all the restrictions and guidelines imposed therein. The achievements on account of strict implementation of NSC and the guidelines provided therein ensuring fair play and good governance in the field of sports and management of NSFs and Associations is laudable. However, in the considered opinion of the Author and in view of the increasing cases before the Court, it is also apparent there is still a long road ahead to achieve an absolutely transparent and fair field to sports persons with limited government and stakeholders interference. A much more detailed and properly framed legislation, instead of scattered notifications/circulars, is essential to ensure the adherence of principles of good governance en-shrined in the NSC, streithearns.

For FY26, Deloitre has predicted India's GDP to grow at 6.75 per cent on the back of rate cuts.

"The global economy is expected to witness a synchronous rebound in 2025 as major election uncertainties get sorted out and the central banks of the West may announce a couple of rate cuts later in 2024. India will likely see improved capital flows and a rebound in exports," Majumdar added.

The development comes just days after the International Monetary Fund (IMF) raised India's growth forecast for FY25 to 6.8 per cent from 6.5 per cent ariler. Deloitte's predictions are, however, lower than the projections by the Reserve Bank of India, which expects the Indian economy to grow 7 per cent in FY25.
