

Sam Pitroda quits as Cong's overseas chief after row

Pitroda, stoked a major controversy with his remarks during a podcast where he cited ethnic and racial identities like Chinese, Africans, Arabs and Whites to describe the physical appearance of Indians from different parts of the country.

ongress leader Sam Pitroda on Wednesday signed as the chairman of the Indian Overseas Congress after his controversial remarks spurred the BJP to label the party "racist".

Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said on X that party chief Mallikarjun Kharge has accepted Pitroda's deci-

sion. "Mr Sam Pitroda has decided to step down as Chairman of the Indian Overseas Congress of his own accord. The Congress President has accepted his decision," Ramesh said in his post.

Pitroda, who held the post of chairman of the Indian Overseas Congress, stoked a major controversy with his remarks during a podcast where he cited ethnic and racial identities like Chinese, Africans, Arabs and Whites to describe the physical appearance of Indians from different

With campaigning in full swing ahead of the fourth phase of polls, Prime Minister Narendra Modi led the BJP's all-out attack on the Congress on Pitroda's analogy and slammed his comments as "racist". He asserted that people will not tolerate the attempt to insult them on

the basis of their skin

At his rallies in Tel-angana and Andhra Pradesh, Modi said he is livid with the racial profiling of Indians by the US-based "philosopher and uncle of 'Shehzada''', and linked the Congress's opposition to Droupadi Murmu's presidential bid to its mindset, which saw her

as an "African" because of her dark skin.

In the podcast, Pitroda said, "We have survived 75 years in a very happy environment where people could live together, leaving aside a few fights here and there.

"We could hold a country as diverse as India together. Where people in the east look like the Chinese, people in the west look like the Arabs, people in the north look like, maybe, white and people in the south look like Africans." "It does not matter. All of us are brothers and sisters. We respect different languages, different religions, different customs, different food," he said.

Earlier during the campaign, his reference to inheritance tax in the United States while discussing the Congress's Lok Sabha poll manifesto gave the ruling BJP a potent handle to accuse the opposition party of eying citizens' assets as part of its "redistribution of wealth" policy.

Chaos at airports as Air India Express cancels flights



New Delhi

ir India Express has cancelled more than 80 flights since Tuesday night with a section of senior cabin crew reporting sick to protest against alleged mismanagement at the Tata Group-owned airline, leaving hundreds of passengers stranded at various airports in the country.

Scores of Air India Express passengers, mostly scheduled to travel to the Gulf nations, protested at airports in Kerala against last-minute flight cancellations.

Some of them claimed that they were informed about the cancellations after the completion of security checks.

On Wednesday, sources said that more than 200 cabin crew are believed to have reported sick to protest against the alleged mismanagement at the airline.

The cabin crew shortage has resulted in the cancellation of at least more than 80 flights since Tuesday night and scores of flights were delayed.

disruptions are happening at various airports, including Kochi, Calicut, Delhi and Bengaluru, they added.

An Air India Express spokesperson said the airline is engaging with the cabin crew members to understand the reasons for reporting sick and also apolo-gised for the flight disruptions.

Discontent has been brewing among a sec-tion of the cabin crew at the low-cost carrier for some time now, especially after the start of the process to merge AIX Connect, formerly AirAsia India, with itself.

The withdrawal has been initiated due to a surplus of available updated vaccines since the pandemic, the company said in a statement.



ment said the Maharashtra Land Revenue Code permits the state government to abolish any revenue area and to name/rename and alter the name of the area.

The court said it has no hesitation to conclude that the government followed the statutory provisions before taking the decision to rename the two districts and cities.

The HC said it was of the opinion that the issue of alteration of name of a revenue area or even a city or town is not justiciable as courts lack the requisite tool to adjudicate such an issue.

"As to by what name a particular object or place is to be known cannot be judicially reviewed unless the name so proposed is atrocious," the high court said.

In 2022, the Maharashtra cabinet headed by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde approved the name of Aurangabad as Chhatrapati Sambhajina-gar and Osmanabad as Dharashiv.

On July 16, 2022, a Government Resolution was passed by the two-member cabinet for changing names and then forwarded to the central government.

In February 2023, the Union Home Ministry gave a no objection letter for changing the names of the cities and districts and thereafter, a gazette notification was issued by the state government changing the names of Aurangabad and Osmanabad.

Several petitions were then filed by Aurangabad residents challenging the government's decision to rename the place as Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar.

Another PIL was filed by 17 residents of Osmanabad against the government's decision to rename it as Dharashiv.

Both the petitions termed the government's decision as "politically motivated". The Maharashtra gov-

ernment had opposed the pleas, claiming the two places were renamed due to their history and not for any political reasons.

BJP Plans to Divide BJD After Elections: Pandian

Bhubaneswar: BJD leader and Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik's close aide V K Pandian on Wednesday alleged that the BJP is fighting elections in the state not to win but to increase its seats with an intention to break the Biju Janata Dal after the polls. The bureaucrat-turned-politician said this while meeting a group of journalists at Gopalpur in Ganjam district on Wednesday. "They (BJP) had a slogan of securing 120 assembly seats in 2014 but failed. I do not know their target for 2019. But, for 2024, they have been fighting elections to win 50/60 seats and aim to break BJD after the elections,' Pandian said.

After Maharashtra, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh, the saffron party wants to follow this strategy in Odisha, he claimed.

Asserting that the BJP's plan will not succeed, Pandian said many people from the national level are coming to campaign in the state,



"Naveen Babu (CM Naveen Patnaik) is the trust of the people," he said. Responding to his allegation, senior BJP leader Samir Mohanty said that the saffron party does not need to break the BJD.

"BJP need not break the BJD. It will break on its own. There are several Eknath Sindhe in BJD who are in constant touch with us," he said.

The BJP is contesting the polls to form government in Odisha, Mohanty said.

Earlier, asked whether he was confident of Patnaik becoming the chief minister for the sixth consecutive time, Padian asserted that the BJD will win the elections with flying colours. "Had I not such conviction, I would not have said that Naveen babu will be sworn in as CM on June 9 with blessings of Maha Prabu Jagan-nath," he said. Pandian claimed that BJP has no candidate in 60 of the 147 assembly seg-ments in Odisha. "They waited for the release of BJD's candidate list so that they could pick up candidates from among the leaders dropped

or rejected by us," he

Pradhan and Bhubaneswar MP Aparajita Sarangi and accused them of attempting to stop the Shree Mandir Parikrama Project (Jagannath temple heritage corridor project). "They tried to stall the project through ASI, National Monuments Authority (NMA) and by filing petitions in High Court and Supreme Court. They also hired an expensive lawyer to ensure the project does not take off," Pandian claimed. Target-ing Pradhan, Pandian claimed that he was rejected by the people of his own district, Dhenkanal. "His party lost in panchayat and urban polls. So, he ran away and filed the nomination paper from nearby Sambalpur Lok Sabha seat. He has done nothing for his own district. Had he done something good for Odisha, our CM would have been liberal not to put any candidate against him.


DU Conducts 'Viksit Bharat Run' Despite Teacher Objections

In a pan-India operation by its Special Cell, the Delhi Police has arrested nine criminals and apprehended one juvenile who were wanted in cases like shootouts, extortions, killings and arms supply to Lawrence Bishnoi-Goldy Brar gang, the officials said.

The police said they have recovered seven pistols, 31 live cartridges and 11 mobile phones from those arrested from Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.

With their arrest, the police claimed to have averted some contract killings and other heinous crimes in Delhi, an officer said.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special Cell) Pratiksha Godara said a team led by inspectors Shiv Kumar and Satish Rana supervised by ACPs Lalit Mohan Negi and Hridya Bhushan has arrested nine operatives of the Bishnoi and Brar syndicate, including one juvenile, from seven states in the country.

Of them, two each have been arrested from Delhi, UP and Punjab, and one each from Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Bihar, Godara said.

Bishnoi is presently lodged in Gujarat's Sabarmati jail, while Brar, whose original name is Satinderjeet Singh, is believed to be hiding in Canada. Brar, who is said to be running a gang from abroad, is wanted by the National Investigation Agency (NIA).

The Bishnoi-Brar gang has been involved in the murders of Punjabi singer Sinddu Moosewala in May 2022 and Karni Sena chief Sukhdev Singh Gogamedi in December 2023. It is also stated to be involved in giving threats to Bolly-

Lovely to Quit Politics Rather Than Leaving BJP Again

Arvinder Singh Lovely, who recently resigned from the Delhi Congress president's post, on Wednesday said he will rather quit politics instead of leaving the BJP that he has now joined.

Lovely along with other senior Delhi Congress leaders, including former minister Raj Kumar Chauhan, Naseeb Singh and Amit Malik, joined the BJP last week.

Previously, he had quit the Congress and joined the BJP along with Malik in April 2017, However, within a few months he switched back to the Congress in 2018.

Since then he was in the Congress that he left over differences with the party leadership over choice of candidates for the Lok Sabha polls in Delhi.

"Last time I had taken the decision to quit the Congress due to anger. This time, however, we have taken the decision with a cool head and much thought. Now, we will do politics here (in BJP) only or quit politics instead of leaving the party," Lovely told reporters at Delhi BJP office.

Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva, who accompanied Lovely, said that he and other leaders will be free to decide their role in the party. Lovely said that in any party, the role of a worker is most important and he will assume that role and campaign for the party where ever he was asked to go. Lovely is one of the 40 star campaigners of the BJP for polls in Delhi.

He hinted that many other leaders in Delhi Congress may join the BJP in coming days.

"Raj Kumar Chauhan is a big leader in North West Delhi but his influence is not limited to that constituency only. Similarly, myself and Naseeb Singh are based in trans Yamuna area where there are two seats. This is just the beginning, if the party allows our other friends too will come," he said. Chauhan, a former minister in Sheila Dikshit government, had incidentally joined the BJP ahead of the Lok Sabha polls after he was denied ticket from North West seat.



Delhi HC Adjourns Sisodia's Bail Hearing, Grants Time to ED, CBI for Response

he Delhi High Court Wednesday granted more time to the ED and the CBI to file their replies to former deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia's pleas seeking bail in the corruption and money-laundering cases lodged by the agencies in relation to the alleged excise policy scam.

Justice Swarana Kanta Sharma, who had on May 3 issued notices to the two agencies asking them to file their replies to the pleas and listed the matter for hearing on Wednesday, was informed by the counsel for the Enforcement Directorate (ED) and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) that they need some more time to respond.

The request made by the agencies' lawyers was opposed by Sisodia's counsel who said he has been incar-



cerated and the ED and the CBI had assured the Supreme Court that the trial will be completed in six

The high court dictated its order saying, "Respondents seek more time to file a reply. It is stated that the ED is in the process of filing another prosecution complaint in relation to a co-accused in the case".

"Irrespective of that, the accused is in custody, and





Komal Ramola Chandigarh: The Election Com-mission of India (ECI) has drawn up a list of 'Dos' and 'Don'ts' to be followed by political parties and contesting candidates till the com-pletion of the process of General Election to Lok Sabha 2024 in Haryana.

Giving more informa-tion, Chief Electoral Officer, Haryana, Anurag Agarwal said that political parties and candidates are advised to follow the guidelines and cooperate in con-ducting the elections in a free, fair and peaceful manner in the State.

While referring to the Dos to be followed by political parties and contesting candidates, he said that with a view to ensure a level playing field, public places like maidans and helipads must be available impartially to all parties and contesting candidates.
He said that during elections, criticism of other political parties and candidates should be restricted only to their politics. their policies, pro-grams, past records, and works.

With this, the right of every individual for peaceful and undisturbed home life should be fully safe-guarded. He further said that the local po-lice authorities should be fully informed and necessary permission is taken well in time, of the proposed meetings, he added.

Anurag Agarwal said that the restrictive or prohibitory orders in force, if any, in the place of the proposed meeting should be fully respected. He said that the permission must be obtained for use of loudspeakers or any other such facilities for the proposed meetings and police assistance should be taken from the police authorities, in case of any disturbance and untoward incident caused by any person.

He said that the time and place of the starting and termination of any procession and the route to be followed should be finalized in advance and prior permissions obtained from the police authorities. The passage of the pro-cession must be without hindrance to traffic.

The Chief Electoral Officer said that cooperation should be extended to all election officials to ensure peaceful and orderly voting. He said that all political workers engaged in elections have to show their badges or identity cards given to them by their parties. The informal identity slip issued to the voters should be on plain (white) paper and on which there should be no mention of any name, party symbol or the name of the

are waiting for or-gan donation in the country and the increase in the number of donors in the country is not keeping pace with the demand; Experts say the country urgently needs to increase deceased donation rates, and there should be more awareness among ICU doctors and families about how a deceased donor can save many lives. With a waiting list of over three lakh patients and at least 20 people dying every day while waiting for an organ, the shortage of organ donation in India, especially deceased donation, is taking a huge toll. The rate of deceased organ donation in India has been less than one donor per million population for the last decade. India needs to increase

this to 65 donations per million population and to do so, public sector healthcare has to step up. There are about 600 medical colleges and more than 20 AIIMS in the country. If we get even one donation from them every year, we will be in a better situation. Even worldwide, only 10% of patients requiring organs receive them on time. Spain and the US have better organ donation systems, with donation rates of 30-50 per million. Training trauma and ICU doctors to help patients' families come forward and donate is the need of the hour, despite the availability of many potential cases, the low rate of organ donation in India is due to an insufficient number of brain death or brain stem death cas-



es. Due to identification and authentication. In terms of organ donation, the country's annual average is still less than one donor per million people.

According to road transport statistics, every year in India, around 150,000 people die on the roads. This means that on average, more than 1000 accidents occur on the roads every day and more than 400 people die. In organ donation, the organs of a deceased donor - such as the heart, liver, kidneys, intestines, eyes, lungs, and pancreas - are removed and transplanted into the body of another person, which is required to survive. They are needed. A deceased donor, also called a cadaver, can thus save up to nine lives. However, health professionals usually feel uncomfortable talking to relatives of the deceased about the topic of organ donation. Doctors shy away

from asking about donating the organs of the deceased. There is no encouragement in this regard and there is also a fear of retaliation.

The public is reluctant and distrustful because they do not fully understand the idea of brain death, organ donation. or its benefits. Cultural customs regarding the body after death may hinder consent, and some religious beliefs prohibit organ donation. India has adequate transplant centers, and medical professionals with the necessary training or resources for the retrieval, preservation, and transportation of organs. There are no resources. It is often necessary to obtain family consent for organ donation. This can be a long and emotionally difficult process, which may delay or even prevent donation. Even in cases where organs are available, access for many patients is further limited

due to the high cost of transplant surgery and post-operative care.

Many patients with organ failure die while waiting for a transplant as a result of acute organ shortage. The overwhelming need for organs leads to illegal organ trade networks. which expose vulnerable people to ethical and health issues as well as exploitation. Puts you in danger. Health disparities are exacerbated by the limited supply of organs, making them more likely for those with money. Receive a life-saving transplant. Dialysis and other supportive care are among the many resources that are heavily taxed by the task of managing patients with end-stage organ failure.

All things considered, India's healthcare system suffers greatly from low organ donation rates, resulting in avoidable deaths, unethical

access to life-saving care. To ensure that everyone has fair access to organ transplantation, addressing these issues requires a multifaceted strategy that includes ethical considerations, legal reform, infrastructure development, and public education. Modi leads BJP's charge as Pitroda's racial analogy for Indians sparks row

New Delhi/Hyderabad Minister Narendra Modi led the BJP's all-out attack on the Congress on Wednesday over Sam Pitroda's analogy to depict India's diversity as he slammed his comments as "racist" and asserted that people will not tolerate the attempt to insult them on the basis of their skin colour.

Pitroda's comments at a podcast landed his party in yet another soup, soon after his reference to inheritance tax in the United States as an "interesting law" while discussing the Congress's Lok Sabha poll manifesto gave the ruling BJP a potent handle to accuse the opposition party of eying citizens' assets as part of its "redistribution of wealth" pol-

As Pitroda's remarks went viral and triggered a political firestorm, the Congress, like the last time, swiftly distanced itself from its overseas wing chairperson's remarks and even criticised those as "most unfortunate and unacceptable".

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) dismissed the Congress's stand as meaningless as it cited Pitroda's close



association with the Gandhi family and launched a blistering attack.

At his rallies in Telangana, Modi said he is livid with the racial profiling of Indians by the US-based "philosopher and uncle of shehzada (Rahul Gandhi)", and linked the Congress's opposition to Droupadi Murmu's presidential bid to its mindset, which saw her as an "African" because of the colour of her skin.

Pitroda, an advisor to former prime minister Rajiv Gandhi, said, "We have survived 75 years in a very happy environment where people could live together, leaving aside a few fights here and there. We could hold the country as diverse as India together. Where people in the east look like the Chinese, people in the west look like the Arabs, people in the

Congress's disassociation with the controversial comments as it noted at a press conference that Pitroda has a history of making "insulting and demeaning" comments, including on terrorism and the 1984 anti-Sikh

His "hua to hua" (so what) reaction to a question on the 1984 communal violence and "it happens all the time" reference to the Pulwama terror attack, both in 2019 as the country was gearing up for the general election, had also created massive rows, while his party had sought to distance itself from those.

At a press conference, Union minister Rajeev Chandrasekhar cited Pitroda's long association with the Gandhi family and said he is explaining Sonia Gandhi's and Rahul Gandhi's idea of India. When a senior Congress leader speaks such language, it reveals the mindset of the party's leadership, which is grounded in divisiveness, racism and ignorance, Chandrasekhar said.

It is shameless, he said, and sought an apology from the Congress. He also asked the chief ministers of four southern states ruled by either the Congress or other opposition parties whether they agree with Pitroda's description of south Indians as Africans.

The Congress's stand is nothing but hypocrisy and they should sack him as the head of the Indian Overseas Congress, the minister said, alleging that Rahul Gandhi only echoes and amplifies Pitroda's views when he "runs down" Indian institutions and democracy during his travels abroad.

BJP spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi said the Congress is getting more and more unmasked as the seven-phase Lok Sabha polls progress and the central issue is no longer election but India's existence.

He said the polls have now become a battle between those under the influence of a foreign mindset

and an India that is "aatmanirbhar" (self-reliant) and brimming with self-pride. Playing other remarks of

Pitroda at the press conference, the BJP MP said the Congress leader believes that issues like Ram temple and Modi going to temples pose a challenge to India's democracy. It betrays his ignorance and contempt of India's fundamental identity as its spirit of democracy and harmonious co-existence is rooted in its culture and traditions, he added.

In a post on X, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said, "I am from South India. I look Indian! My team has enthusiastic members from northeast India. They look Indian! My colleagues from west India look Indian! But, for the racist who is the mentor of Rahul Gandhi we all look African, Chinese, Arab and the White! Thanks for revealing your mindset and your attitude. INDI alliance's shame!

"Sam, Pity-roda on you!" Union minister Anurag Thakur said on X.

Parties Misusing Caste Reservations to Appease Minorities: Rathore

BJP leader and Rajasthan Minister Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore on Wednesday accused the INDIA bloc and the Congress of trying to "snatch" the reservations for SCs, STs and OBCs and giving it to Muslims. Rathore alleged that the country's Constitution is in "danger" because of them and also accused them of corruption.


Rathore made the remark during the roadshowhere in east Delhi's Kalyanpuri area where he had come to support Harsh Malhotra, the BJP candidate for the Lok Sabha elections. He further accused the

Congress-led UPA government of harbouring black money during its tenure and giving rise to corruption. Rathore claimed that after the BJP government came to power in 2014, politics was made free of corruption through electoral bonds. "After 2014, electoral bonds came which means that black money ended. Today, people can know which party takes how much money from where, it is because of Narendra Modi ji. The black money-related corruption got out of politics. During the earlier government, the UPA-led Congress used black money. "They are the same people who are against electoral bonds, they are the same people who want to change reservation. They want to give reservation to Muslims. They have already done this in Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka," he said. Rathore said, "Today, if reservation for STs, SCs, OBCs is in danger, it is be-

the INDIA alliance. In fact, the Constitution is in danger because of them. "It is PM Modi's resolution and guarantee that the Constitution will be saved at all cost. The Congress wants to change the Constitution and they were the ones who changed it during Emergency," he added. A crowd of BJP supporters, including women of all ages, had gathered here with cutouts of Prime Minister Narendra Modi carrying "Mai hun Modi ka parivar (I am Modi's family)" message written over them. India to Achieve Poverty **Eradication Within 10-15** Years, says Rajnath Singh



Bhawanipatna Asserting that the BJP will win all the 21 Lok Sabha seats in Odisha, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Wednesday claimed that poverty would be completely eradicated from India in the next 10-15 years and this is "Modi's guarantee".

Singh addressed two election rallies in Bhawanipatna, the district headquarters of Kalahandi, and Rayagada. 'Though all Congress leaders from Jawaharlal Nehru to Indira Gandhi, Rajiv Gandhi and Manmohan Singh promised to end poverty, they failed. However, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has started the process to end poverty," he claimed.

Noting that about 25 crore people have been lifted from below the poverty line under the Modi regime, the defence minister said that this is not the BJP's claim but as per the Niti Aayog's data.

No previous government had done what PM Modi did during his rule, he claimed.

"No family in India will be without a pucca house, piped drinking water and LPG connection in the next five years," he asserted.

Singh said that earlier, articles were written on "poverty tourism" in Kalahandi as the district was known for hunger, starvation deaths and poverty but things have undergone a massive change under the Modi government.

Lauding the oratory skills of BJP's Kalahandi Lok Sabha seat candidate Malavika Devi, Singh appealed to the people of Kalahandi to cast their votes on the 'lotus' symbol of the BJP for 'highlighting local issues at the national level".

Raebareli: Asserting that people of the country want change and are fed up of being "lied" to, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Wednesday said Prime Narendra Minister Modi has been "using his imagination a lot in his speeches of late and not speaking on the basis of facts.

Her remarks came a day after Prime Minister Modi claimed the Congress will reverse the Supreme Court verdict on the Ram temple if voted to power just like its landmark 1985 ruling in the Shah Bano case was overturned by the Rajiv Gandhi government as part of the party's appeasement politics.

Asked about her assessment of the ground situation after three rounds of the seven-phase polls, Priyan-ka Gandhi said, "My assessment is that peoassessment is that people are wanting change. Everywhere I go I get the sense that people are fed up now of being lied to, they are fed up with the level of discussion that is taking place in the media and on in the media and on political stages." "They want their problems to be discussed, they want solutions, they want to know what has the government done for un-employment, what has it done to reduce prices which are so high, what is it doing to actually help the farmer, help the labourer, help the peo-ple with their problems," she said.

Priyanka Gandhi also said she gets the im-pression that winds of change are blowing in the country.

London: British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak on Wednesday suffered a humiliating defection from his party

benches as a Conservative member of Parliament walked across the floor of the House of Commons to join the Opposition Labour ranks.

Natalie Elphicke, MP for Dover, said the Tories under Sunak "have become a byword for incompetence and division" in a resignation statement just moments before the weekly Prime Minister's Questions (PMQs).

The 43-year-old British Indian leader went on to face off with Labour Leader Keir Starmer, who made the most of the shock move which marks the second defection from the Tories to Labour in two weeks and comes on the back of bruising local election results for the governing party.

"When I was elected in 2019, the Conservative Party occupied the



centre ground of British politics. The party was about building the future and making the most of the opportunities that lay ahead for our country," Elphicke, a staunch critic of the Labour Party until only a few days ago, said in her resignation letter.

"Since then, many things have changed. The elected prime minister was ousted in a coup led by the unelected Rishi Sunak. Under Rishi Sunak, the Con-

servatives have become a byword for incompetence and division. The centre ground has been abandoned and key pledges of the 2019 manifesto have been ditched," she said. She added that the

Labour Party under Starmer has "changed out of all recognition" and its policies "can be trusted".

"We need to move on from the broken promises of Rishi Sunak's tired and chaotic gov-

ernment," she declared. The dramatic moment of her crossing the floor of the House was followed by Starmer asking Sunak: "What is the point of this failed government staggering on" when the Tory MP on the front line of the small boats migration crisis on the coastline of Dover has openly attacked Sunak's handling of a priority issue

like illegal migration. "If he thinks his own MPs joining the Labour

Party are wrong if he thinks anyone believes any of the nonsense that he spouts, why doesn't he put it to the test and call a general election," questioned Starmer, in a series of stinging attacks during PMQs.

Sunak chose to ignore the question, instead accusing his opponent of having "out of touch values" with the British people.

"He snipes from the sidelines, the Conservatives are building a better future," said Sunak. At the end of April,

Dan Poulter, a doctor and Central Suffolk North Ipswich and member of Parliament for the Tories, had announced he was switching his al-legiance to Labour be-fore standing down as a parliamentarian at the next general election because he can no longer defend the Tory government's track record on the National Health Service (NHS).

Police & lawyers clash in Pakistan's Punjab province; more than 25 injured

Lahore: Violent clashes left more than 25 injured outside a court in Punjab province on Wednesday, following which police arrested over 50 lawyers even as the bar council gave a call for a country-wide strike on Thursday against police brutality.

The clashes between the lawyers and the police took place outside the Lahore High Court (LHC) on Mall Road here over the issue of registering terrorism cases against the law-yers associated with jailed former prime minister Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party and shifting of lower courts to a dif-

ferent location. The Mall Road became a battleground between riot police and lawyers after the latter tried to enter the LHC. The riot police baton-charged the protesting lawyers, also fired tear gas and used water cannons to disperse them.

Punjab police claimed they have arrested over 50 lawyers, soon after

which the Pakistan Bar Council gave a countrywide strike call on Thursday against al-leged Punjab police brutality.

During the clashes over two-dozen lawyers policemen sustained injuries. "At least 14 policemen, including two senior officers, are among the injured who have been shifted to hospital," Lahore senior police officer Kamran Faisal said.

Faisal claimed that it was the lawyers who first pelted stones at police that reacted and fired tear gas and used water cannons to disperse

CEA Optimistic, Forecasts

8% GDP Growth in FY24


hief Economic Adviser V Anantha Nageswaran Wednesday said there was a high possibility of GDP growth touching 8 per cent in FY24 on the back of robust growth registered during the three quarters of the financial year ended March 2024.

India's gross domestic product (GDP) grew by 8.4 per cent in the third quarter ended December 2023. In the second quarter, the GDP growth was 7.6 per cent while 7.8 per cent in the first quarter.

"The IMF has projected a growth rate of 7.8 per cent for FY24. But if you look at the trajectory of growth in the first three quarters, obviously, the possibility that the growth rate touches 8 per cent is quite high," he said at an event organised by NCAER here.

This is higher than RBI's India growth estimate of 7.5 per cent for 2023-24.

For the ongoing fi-



nancial year, he said the International Monetary Fund has an estimate of 6.8 per cent but the Reserve Bank of India expects a 7 per cent GDP growth for FY25.

"If that materialises, of course, it will be the fourth consecutive year after COVID starting from FY22 that the economy will have grown at 7 per cent or more. The RBI forecast of 7 per cent for FY25 turns out to be either correct or even underestimate, then it would be the fourth consecutive year of 7 or higher growth rate," he said. However, he said,

lot would depend on how the monsoon shapes up. Although the expectations are that there will be an above-normal monsoon, spatial and temporal

distribution will matter. On the growth beyond FY25, he said, there is a possibility of India growing between 6.5-7 per cent because the key difference this decade compared to the last is the one of balance sheet strength in the financial sector and the non-financial sector in the corporate sector as

The investment made in supply-side augmen-

and digital infrastructure has placed the economy to pursue non-inflationary growth, he said, adding that this also helps absorb the chal-

lenge of overheating. He also expressed hope that there would be no nasty upside to inflation at the moment and it may moderate further to median range of 4 per cent in the coming months.

"There can always be scenarios in geopolitics that can cause inflation to be more than we expect, but at this point the baseline scenario is that inflation gradually converges to the mid-point of the target range." The government mandates the monetary policy committee to keep inflation within a target range of 2 per cent to 6 per cent.

He also said that the household sector's net financial savings flows were lower in 2022-23 at 5.1 per cent due to the bulk of savings shifting to real sectors.

Skipper Sanju Samson's departure left Rajasthan Royals in a tight spot but the team still should have won the IPL match against Delhi Capitals here, says their head coach Kumar Sangakkara. In a chase of 222, Samson got out after making 86 off 46 balls. His dismissal left the Royals with a task of getting 60 runs from 27 balls and eventually they fell short by 20 runs Tues-

A win would have ensured a play-offs spot for the Royals and exit for the Capitals but the result meant that the hosts stayed alive in the tournament.

"Irrespective of that dismissal, we still should have probably seen that game home," Sangakkara said at the postmatch press conference.

"Losses happen. We had a great run at the start of the season. We bowled brilliantly in this game, especially Ashwin but once you make too many casual mistakes, it becomes very hard. At the end of the day it's about execution." Samson was not a happy man when he left the field because there were doubts if Shai Hope, who caught him at the boundary ropes, had touched the fence.

The decision was referred to the TV umpire who ruled Samson out but the Royals skipper chose to argue with onfield umpire before walking back.

Sangakkara said it is difficult sometimes even for the third umpire to make a call.

"It depends on replays and angles, and sometimes you think the foot's touched. But it is a difficult one for the third umpire to judge. The game was at a crucial stage, so that happens in 18 points and qualify for the play-offs.

"We have different perspectives on it. At the end of the day, you have to stand by that decision in terms of what the umpires did. If we have any other kind of opinion on it, we will share it with the umpire and sort it out." The coach was happy with Samson's batting approach.

"Sanju Samson has a lot of clarity about the way he should bat. There are certian stages where he seems to lose his concentration a little bit and we worked on that in the off season. It is really important for him, not just as a captain but as a batter. He is exceptionally talented," he said, adding that he takes very good care of the group.

The catch by Hope, who stumbled before regaining his balance, was hailed by Capitals' assistant coach Pravin

"In IPL some moments are very crucial, and it was a deciding moment in the game," Amre said.

ICC urged to prioritize Test cricket preservation amid T20's

ascendancy: Lara

Admitting that T20 leagues have devoured a lot of Test cricket's space, West Indian legend Brian Lara has appealed to the ICC to step in to give a structure to the unrelenting invasion of the franchise-based tournaments. In the latest instance that fuelled questions over the relevance of Tests, South Africa recently sent an under-strength squad to New Zealand as their firstchoice players were involved in the SA20 at home. "I think ICC (should) put their head together and find a way where franchise cricket takes over, but in a much more structured way and not in terms of the free fall that is going on at the moment," Lara said in an interaction with PTI editors at its headquarters which was facilitated by Star Sports where he is a commenta-

tor and expert for the ongoing IPL.

"I hope the astute thinkers could find a way to make sure that it (Test) remains relevant. I like the Test Championship and I think it is important to make sure that the game remains relevant." So, is cricket now taking the football route where leagues take precedence over international assignments? While Lara agreed in principle to the point, he found differences too in the two models. "Well, yes (cricket following the football way). Let's just look at football. For instance, other than the big cups - European cups, World Cup, South American cups they may have a few friendlies. So, Barcelona, Manchester United, Manchester City, they have their footballers generally for 11 months of the year. "That seems to be working for football. It's taken off the burden as well for each country to be finding ways of making money by having football matches," Lara began. But Lara said the wealth being accumulated among three big nations - India, Australia and England – presented a rather different scenario in cricket. "The West Indies now is in a situation where our gate receipts can't make us survive.

Hayden lauds Samson's IPL show, says he is handling both spin and pace with finesse

Former Australian opener Mathew Hayden is mighty impressed with the IPL performance of Sanju Samson and has lauded the T20 World Cup-bound power-hitter for "handling both spin and pace with finesse".

Samson was in his elements on Tuesday when he nearly guided Rajasthan Royals to a win over Delhi Capitals with his 86-run knock here. The visitors eventually fell short by 20 runs. He is currently third on the top-scorers chart with 471 runs in 11 matches so far.

"He times his innings well. He's got the power. And the power is a big thing in T20 cricket. Yet, what stands out is his commitment to his team. He

wards the end of the match," he added. Samson, who is the captain of Rajasthan Royals, has taken the second wicketkeeper's slot in the Indian team for the T20 World Cup starting June 1 in the Americas.

Former India cricketer Varun Aaron also praised his performance.

"I think Sanju Samson has been batting really well. Bowlers are keen on dismissing him, evident from their reluctance to bowl bouncers despite being allowed two per over in this IPL.

"Interestingly, the over he got out, Khaleel Ahmed bowled the first bouncer to him in the match.

This seemed to disrupt his footwork, as the subsequent wide slow ball, which he typically dispatches for six over covers, resulted in his dismissal," he

Jaiswal Poised to Break Lara's Records, According to Former West Indies Legend

Yashasvi Jaiswal's Test career is just nine games old but the great Brian Lara feels if there is anyone who can get close to his lofty feats, including the record 400 not out, it is the 22-year-old southpaw from India.

Lara's high praise for Jaiswal doesn't come out of the blue. The left twohanders share a special bond, having spent a lot of time over the past year following their "4 am conversation" during the IPL when the West Indian was coaching Sunrisers Hyderabad and the young opener was in the Rajasthan Royals' camp.

A lot has changed since IPL 2023 with Jaiswal now becoming an integral part of India's Test and T20 team. His exploits in the longest format stand out as he averages close to 70 with three

"If I feel my records are threatened, Jaiswal has got a very good chance to do so. He has got capabilities, couple of double hundreds already. Lara, who recently turned 55, is one of the all-time greats of the game having amassed close to 12, 000 runs in Tests and over 10,000 runs in ODIs. His record of the highest individual total, 400 not out against England in 2004, still stands tall.

Lara fondly looked back at his first meeting with Jaiswal when asked about a light moment they shared on the sidelines of the Rajasthan Royals and SRH clash in the ongoing season.

Olympic Flame Arrives in Marseille with Grand Ceremony and Tight Security

Marseil

xcitement is building in the southern French city of Marseille, where a majestic three-mast ship carrying the Olympic torch arrived from Greece ahead of a welcoming ceremony at sunset Wednesday.

Paris Games organizers have promised "fantastic" celebrations in the city, where the Old Port has been placed under high security.

The torch was lit in Greece last month before it was officially handed to France. It left Athens aboard a ship named Belem, which was first used in 1896, and spent twelve days at sea.

More than a thousand boats will accompany the Belem's parade around the Bay of Marseille. The ship will dock on a pontoon that looks like an athletics track in the Old Port.

The welcoming ceremony at dusk on Wednesday will include a demonstration by the jets of the Patrouille de France, the acrobatic team of the French air force.

"The return of the Games to our country will be a fantastic celebration," said Paris 2024 Olympics Organizing Committee President Tony Estanguet.

"As a former athlete, I know how important the start of a competition is. That is why we chose Marseille, because it's definitely one of the cities most in love with sports," added Estanguet, a former Olympic canoeing star with gold medals from the 2000, 2004 and 2012 Games. Safety of visitors and residents has been a top priority for authorities in Marseille, France's second largest city with nearly a million inhabitants. About 8,000 police officers have been de-



ployed around in the harbour where tens of thousands of spectators are expected to gather for the ceremony. Thousands of firefighters and bomb disposal squads have been positioned around the city along with maritime police and anti-drone teams patrolling the city's waters and its airspace, "It's a monumental day and we have been working hard for visitors and residents of Marseille to enjoy this historical moment," said Yannick Ohanessian, the city's deputy mayor. The torch relay will start on Thursday in Marseille, before heading to Paris through iconic places across the country, from the world-famous Mont Saint-Michel to D-Day landing beaches in Normandy and the Versailles Palace. Many people and families were strolling along the boardwalk on the Mediterranean, beaming with excitement and curiosity. A band of musicians, wearing T-shirts with the slogan "Marseille, proud to welcome the Olympics Flame," entertained tourists and residents as well as workers who were setthan sport," she added. "It conveys a message to the world and the torch relay is a symbol of peace." Olympic swimmer Florent Manaudou has been chosen to be the first carrier of the flame in France. Manaudou, who won four Olympic medals, is the brother of swimmer Laure Manaudou, who won three Olympic medals at Athens in 2004.

"We are extremely proud," Marseille

"We are extremely proud," Marseille mayor Benoit Payan said. "This is where it all begins." The show will "dazzle the world," said Payan, adding that up to 150,000 spectators are expected in the Old Port.

Marseille people "have a sense of celebration, a sense of the game, sport and Olympism in their guts," he said, recalling that the city was founded by Greek colonists some 2.600 years ago.

Heavy police and military presence was seen patrolling Marseille's city center Tuesday, as a military helicopter flew over the Old Port, where a range of barriers have been set up.

French Interior Ministry spokesperson Camille Chaize said officials were prepared for security threats including terrorism.

"We're employing various measures, notably the elite National Gendarmerie Intervention Group unit, which will be present in the torch relay from beginning to end," she said.

The Olympic cauldron will be lit after the Games' opening ceremony that will take place on the River Seine on July 26.

The cauldron will be lit at a location in Paris that is being kept top-secret until the day itself. Among reported options are such iconic spots as the Eiffel Tower and the Tuileries Gardens outside the Louvre Museum.

AIFF panel approves Prevention of Sexual Harassment policy

Rocked by allegations of physical assault against its executive member Deepak Sharma, the All India Football Federation on Wednesday approved and implemented the AIFF Prevention of Sexual Harassment (PoSH) Policy with immediate effect.

The decision was arrived at by the AIFF executive committee, following thorough deliberations and careful consideration, the federation said in a statement.

The AIFF PoSH Policy, which is based on the PoSH Act 2013, is aimed at ensuring a safe and inclusive environment within the football community. It has been crafted and vetted by the AIFF legal team.

The decision comes weeks after allegations of physical abuse against Sharma. The executive committee member who is also the owner of Himachal Pradesh-based football club Khad FC was accused by two women footballers of physically assaulting them on the night of March 28 in a drunken state.

Following the incident, Sharma was arrested by Goa Police and was later released on bail.

In another case, a woman employee at the AIFF headquarters here had lodged a "verbal" complaint of "harassment" against a male colleague. The woman, however, did not press a formal charge.

Before that there was also the Alex Ambrose sexual harassment case that created crisis in Indian football less than two years ago. The incident came to fore in July 2022 when the assistant head coach of the Indian U-17 women's football



team, Ambrose, was sacked for sexual misconduct by the Supreme Court-appointed Committee of Administrators (CoA) which was handling the day-to-day affairs of AIFF back then.

On the implementation of the policy, AIFF acting secretary general M Satyanarayan said, "The need for a PoSH policy exclusively for the AIFF staff was much needed. We have drafted this by taking policies as per the PoSH Act of 2013 and the policies in a few other organisations as well and incorporated them into our policy.

"Our PoSH policy has been designed in a way that it can be altered and adapted as we go forward. Along with this, we have also planned to have an expert on the PoSH policy to address our staff at least three times a year to keep reminding them of it." "It is essential, especially for our junior and women's teams. We feel it is necessary for all stakeholders in various positions to be fully aware of the PoSH policy," he said.

Malaysian Soccer Star and Two Others Targeted in Series of Acid Attacks

A Malaysian international footballer has been splashed by acid and two other top players were attacked within a week by unknown assailants, in a rare outbreak of violence targeting athletes in the country. Police criminal investigation chief Mohamad Shuhaily Mohamad Zain said Wednesday that there were similarities in the three attacks and that the victims appeared to have been targeted. But investigators have not determined whether the cases were linked.

Faisal Halim, who plays as a winger for the national team and Malaysian club Selangor, was hospitalized with fourth-degree burns following an acid attack by two assailants at a shopping mall on Sunday. He was reported to be in critical but stable condition, with limited movement and speech.

Just three days earlier, another

Akhyar Rashid, was assaulted in a robbery outside his house in eastern Terengganu state after his return from training. He was hit with an iron rod, leaving him head and leg injuries. His attackers fled after taking money from him. Late Tuesday, former national team captain Safiq Rahim was tailed by two assailants on a motorbike after a training session in southern Johor state. They later threatened him with a hammer and smashed his car's rear window but he was not physically hurt.

Now it's a do-or-die situation for all Indian wrestlers at Istanbul where the two finalists in each category will be awarded the quotas. A third quota will be given to the wresters who emerges winner in the bout between the two bronze medallists.

Asia needs Asia's best players to shine on home soil: ATF President Yuriy Polskiy

New Delhi

Determined to change the face of Asian tennis in his tenure, Yuriy Polskiy, the youngest ATF President, has exhorted the best players from the region to compete in Asian events before travelling abroad and has set his sights on developing the game in smaller tennis-playing nations such as Nepal, Bangladesh, Myanmar and Syria.

The 36-year-old Polskiy had won the Asian Tennis Federation (ATF) presidential elections in December last year on the back of reforms in his home country Kazakhstan and wants to use his trouble-shooting experience to help nations struggling to popularise the game.

Polskiy is clear that Asia's strong players need to compete in their own events which should help upcoming players with exposure and learning, and a robust Asian tour and programme for U14 players with considerable financial support is the need of the hour.

He is also clear that ATF would work in tandem with ATP rather than competing with them and create a viable Asian tour with lots of tournaments in close vicinity that will reduce the travel expenses of players from the re-

Asia has only six players in the



world's top-100 and it worries Polskiv.

"Asian tennis needs the participation of the best Asian players in Asian tournaments, because, quite often, they go to Europe, they go to North America, South America and it means that the local Asian players don't have a chance to compete with the best," Polskiy said in an interview.

"And to go to Europe, it's very costly. So the ones who are good, they spend a lot of money, which can be redistributed, you know, in order to increase the base, like you will send not only the best ones to the tournaments, but the number two, three, four, because with the kids, you never know who will eventually be the best player.

"So, you need the competition inside the country, you need the competition inside of your region, and you need the high competition in Asia." Polskiy understands that Asia is very strong in the eastern countries such as Japan, Korea, China, Taiwan, India, Thailand and Kazakhstan but the continent needs more tennis-playing nations.

"In recent years, Uzbekistan (grew), also Iran has a big history, and I feel that smaller nations like Iraq, Syria, Nepal, Myanmar, Timor-Leste and others, also deserve a chance, and they have big population." Polskiy said they are now working with the Grand Slams, with ITF, in order to improve the quality of tournaments in Asia. The ATF President said the players will get incentives for playing in Asia.

"We (should) give extra incentives to good Asian players to play on Asian circuit. So they don't spend their time competing for nothing, there is something meaningful they get, they get the ranking, they get the grants, there is an Asian team of the best players in each age category, so they can get in there and get extra support from ITF."
