## Rumours being spread that Waqf bill will interfere with Muslim affairs: Shah

Speaking in LS on the Waaf amendment bill. Amit Shah said non-Muslims in Waqf bodies are meant purely for ensuring administration of properties in accordance with stated aims ■Union Minister Kiren Rijiju introduced the bill, which seeks to amend the Waqf Act, 1995. Opposition has condemned the bill as unconstitutional, calling it an attack on religious freedom.

The bill has nothing to do with religion, but deals only with properties, he said tabling the Bill, which was examined and redrafted by a joint committee of Parliament.

The government is not going to interfere in any religious institution. The changes made in the Waqf law by the UPA government gave it overriding effect over other statutes, hence the new amendments were restatutes, nence the new amendments were re-quired," Rijiju said amid noisy opposition protests. "You (opposition) tried to mislead the people on issues which are not part

of the Waqf Bill," she said to the opposition. Both ministers assert-ed that the proposed re-forms would ensure the welfare of poor Muslims

welfare of poor Muslims and women.

The BJP was bolstered by a show of support from its key allies like the TDP, JD(U), Shiv Sena and Lok Janshakt! Party (Ram Vilas), while the INDIA bloc put up a united show in opposing the bill.

After most of the leading opposition leaders had spoken, Shah launched a stout defence of the bill and rejected the most common criticism that the appointment of non-Muslims in the Waqf council and boards violated a community's right to manage its own affairs.

The Rajva Sabha pa passed the Bill by voice vote on Wednesday after various amendments moved by Opposition members were negated. The proposed legislation also provides for mandatory reporting of information about foreigners by hotels, universities, other educational institutions, hospitals and nursing educational institutions, hospitals and nursing homes to enable track-ing of overstaying for-

## India's manufacturing sector growth hits 8-month high in March: PMI

New Delhi:

India's manufacturing activity recovered the lost ground lost in February, picking up to its highest in eight months, at 58.1 in March as against 56.3 in the previous month, data released by S&P Global on Wednesday showed. The latest reading showed a substantial improvement in the health of the sector that was above its long-run average. Per the release, the rise was driven by stronger new orders growth as the new orders index recorded an eight-month high of 61.5 March saw total sales expand to the greatest extent since July 2024, with companies remarking on positive customer interest, favourable demand conditions and successful marketing initiatives. marketing initiative

Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, said, "India registered a 58.1 manu-



facturing PMI in March, up substantially from 56.3 during the previous month. Although inter-national orders slightly slowed, overall demand momentum remained robust, and the new orders index recorded an eight-month high an eight-month high of 61.5. Strong demand prompted firms to tap into their inventories,

causing the fastest drop in finished goods stocks in over three years. Business expectations remained fairly optimistic, with around 30 per cent of survey participants foreseeing greater output volumes in the year ahead, compared to less than 2 per cent that anticipate a contraction.

This is a rise of 19%, or 209 locomotives more than the 1,472 produced in the previous year, marking the

produced in the previ-ous year, marking the highest production rate ever recorded in the country, they said.

The growth in pro-duction is largely at-tributed to the "Make in India" initiative, which has boosted manufac

India" initiative, which has boosted manufacturing efforts. Over the past ten years, India produced a total of 9,168 locomotives, almost doubling the annual average from 470 to about 917.

New Delhi:
Observing even a criminal enjoyed certain protections, the Supreme Court has directed the director generals of police (DGP) of all the states and UTs to strictly adhere to all safeguards available to persons in custody.

available to persons in custody.

A bench comprising Justices Ahsanuddin Amanullah and Prashant Kumar Mishra called the police a very vital part of the state machinery, having a direct bearing on the safety and security of the society at large and individuals in par-

ticular.
"The need, therefore for maintaining the confidence of individuals and society-at-large in the police is paramount," it added. The court referred to



a checklist shown by the counsel for Haryana under Section 41(1)(b) (ii) of the Code of Criminal

Procedure, 1973.

"Perusal of the same prima facie does not inprima facie does not in-spire confidence. Rath-er, it appears that only as a formality, the same has been submitted. We express our strong res-ervations with regard to filling-up of the checklist in a mechanical man-

ner," the bench's March 26 order said. The top court's obser-vations came after a mar vations came after a man alleged he was held by Haryana Police in viola-tion of the law on arrest aside from being sub-jected to physical abuse during his detention and inside the police station. In support of such ar-gument, the petitioner's counsel referred to an e-mail sent by his broth-

er at around 11.24 am on the same day to the superintendent of police concerned over his brother's alleged arrest. The counsel alleged physical torture in the police station was only after the e-mail was sent to the higher officials "as a knee jerk reaction" and an FIR was lodged two hours later at around 1.30 pm.

The top court observed there appeared to be "evident high-handedness" on the part of

According to the city's current and future needs for an effective drainage system, the Delhi government has been working on a new drainage master plan since 2021.

The PWD has divided the

since 2021.

The PWD has divided the city into three basins -- Najafgarh, Barapullah, and Trans-Yamuna -- and hired consultants to redesign the drainage network.

As part of the plan, these consultants have analysed factors like slopes, depressions, and the existing old and incapable infrastructure to improve drainage efficiency, he said.

While deslitting is haralleled by multiple civic bodies, the PWD maintains 2,064 km of stormwater drains along all the main roads, covering almost 55 per cent of the city's entire drain length of 3,740,31 km. The PWD is the nodal agency on drainage in the city.

Delhi's last drainage mas-

Delhi's last drainage mas-ter plan was prepared in 1976 when the population of the city was just 60 lakh. According to rough esti-mates, the population has now gone up to around two crore. In 2023, 308 water logging hotspots were iden-tified by the traffic police due to several factors like unprecedented rainfall; and lack of proper drainage Delhi's last drainage mas unprecedented rannan; and lack of proper drainage which led to backflow of water and stagnation at hese locations.

arguments, justice "de-manded the truth must be discerned" to determine the

cused's guilt. The DNA testing, the judge said, might even ben-efit the accused and there could be no presumption of it being in favour of the complainant father.

"In fact if there can be any independent evidence which may help in determi-nation of the guilt or inno-cence of the accused perns must not be refu be brought on record on the specious ground of delay especially when it entails such serious offence as (IPC) Section 302 (murder)," the court said.




